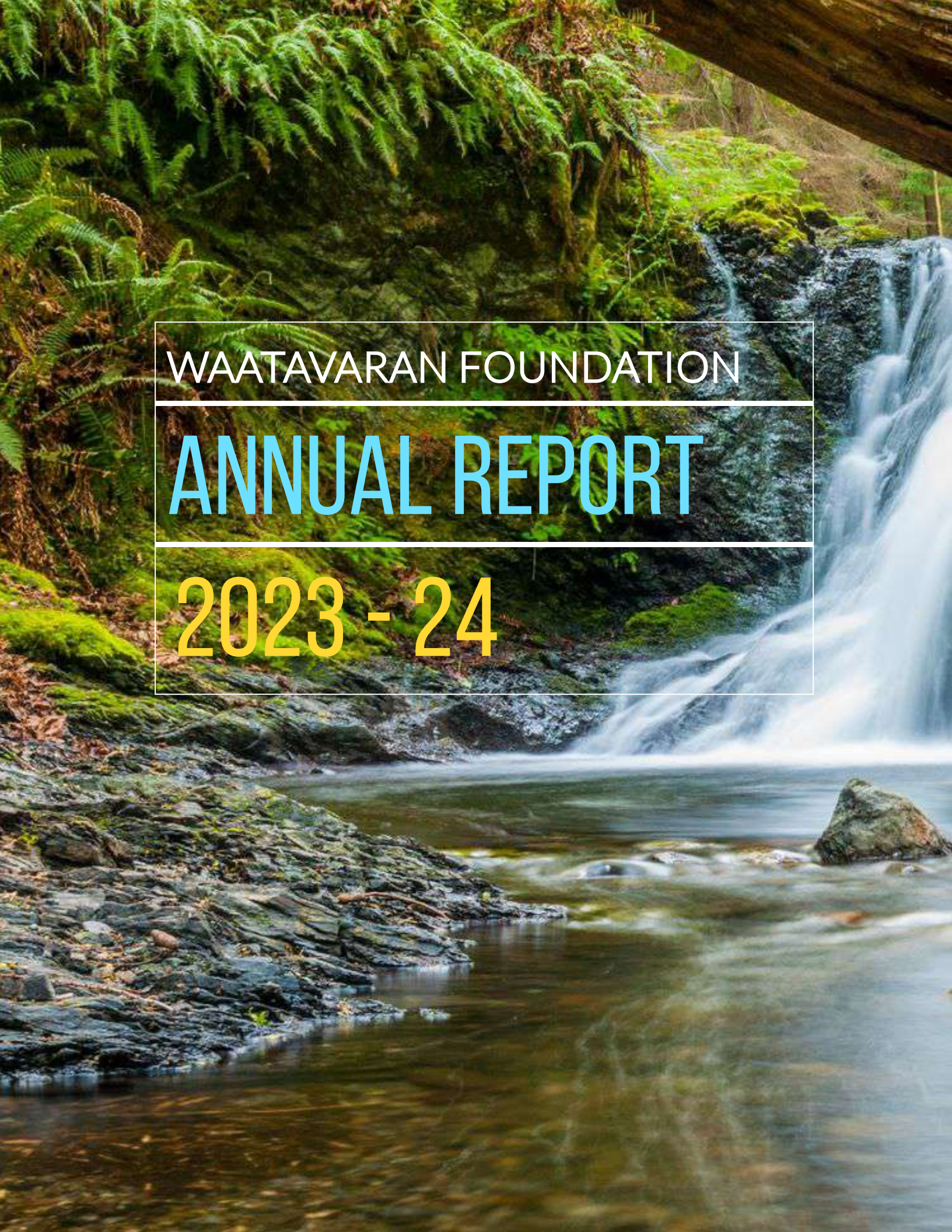

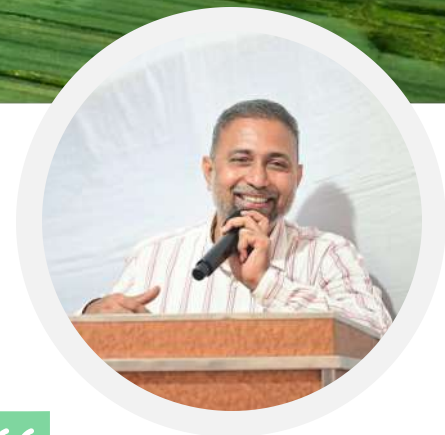


From Our Founder

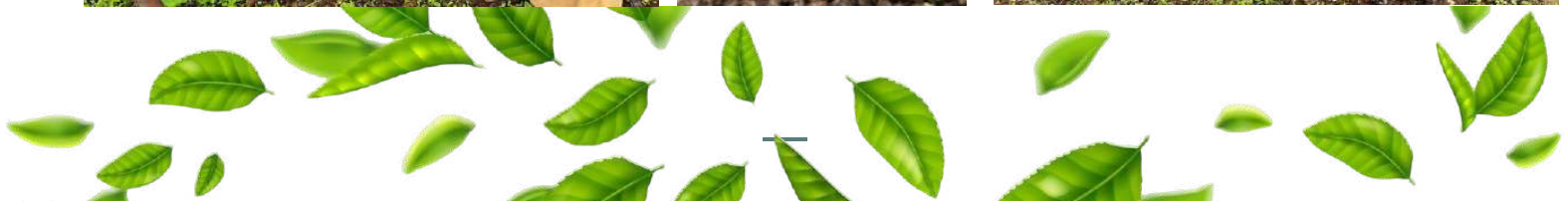

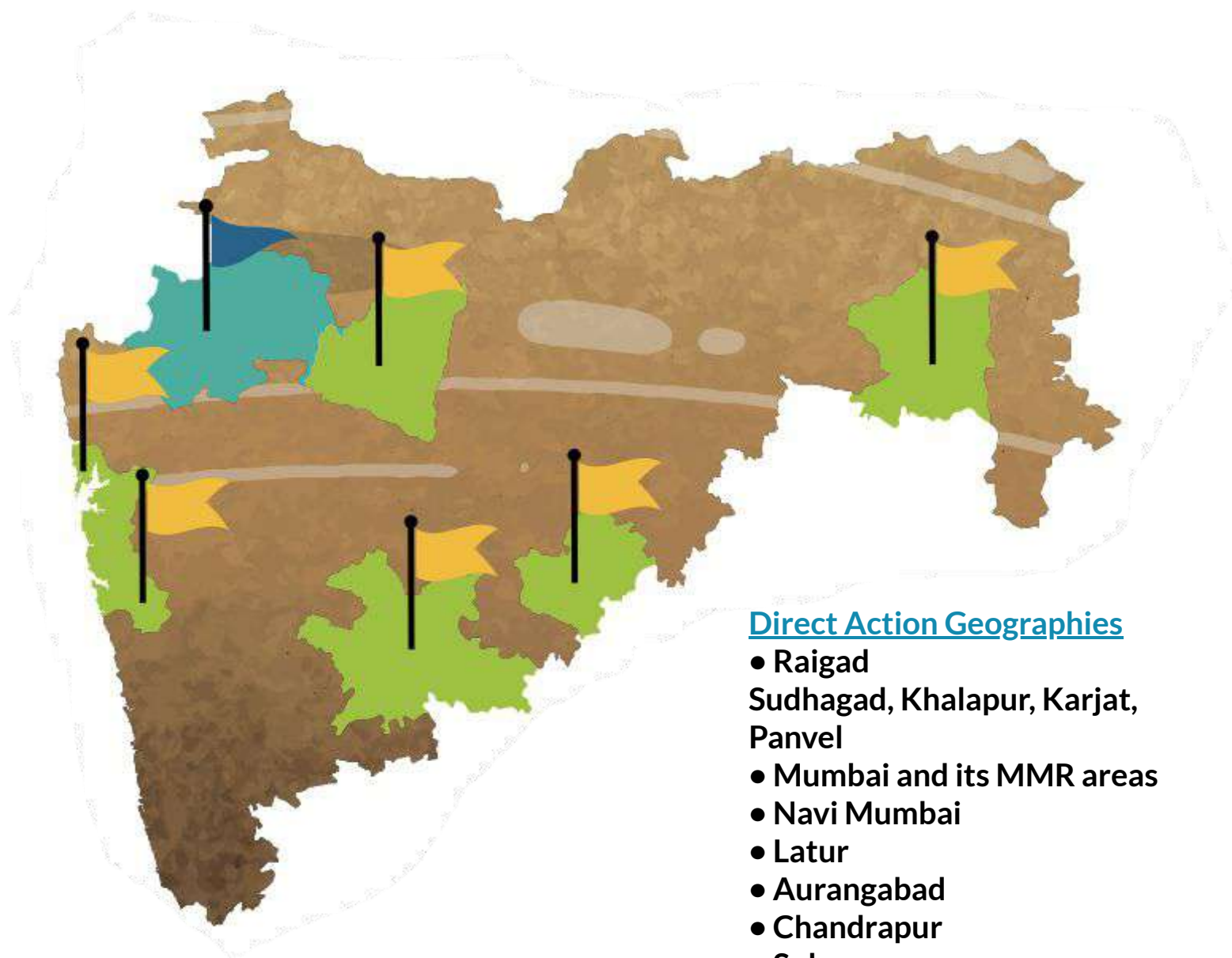
4.0 2023-24 at a Glance

6.0 Thematic Highlights

Working With the Communities

From this financial year, we have started working with an upgraded approach of working with the communities for forest management, protection and conservation. We are intensively working with 15 villages of Raigad district in Maharashtra State with a focus on managing the community forest rights and resources of these villages.

Women on the other hand, are playing a crucial role in managing the forest resources. Women are compulsorily, either the President or the Secretary of the Community Forest Resource Management Committees (CFRMCs) that we have formed in these 15 tribal villages. By being in such a mainstream role, they are getting a platform to showcase their leadership, showcase their agency and self-determination in taking important decisions for their village.



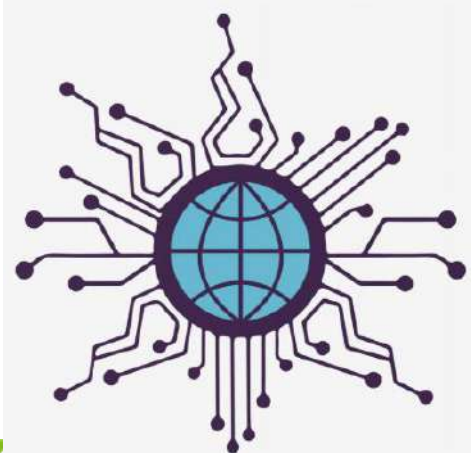

Working With the Government

For this initiative, the support of the government authorities from the Forest Department, Tribal Development Department, Revenue Department and various other important concerned Line Departments. They are our constant pillar of support when it comes to taking new initiatives, granting permissions and supporting us in successful implementation of the Forest Rights Act, 2006.

Leveraging the Support of Technology

Technology plays another important role in boosting and speeding up the initiatives. We use the Survey123 tool designed with the help of Cadasta Foundation which is a GIS-based land mapping tool. Ancestral forest land parcels are digitally mapped using this tool, and satellite images of the same are created. This acts as a crucial evidence or an accurate boundary of the Community Forest Rights recognised land by the government. The tribals are trained on the use of this tool, and they themselves map their ancestral forest land parcels.



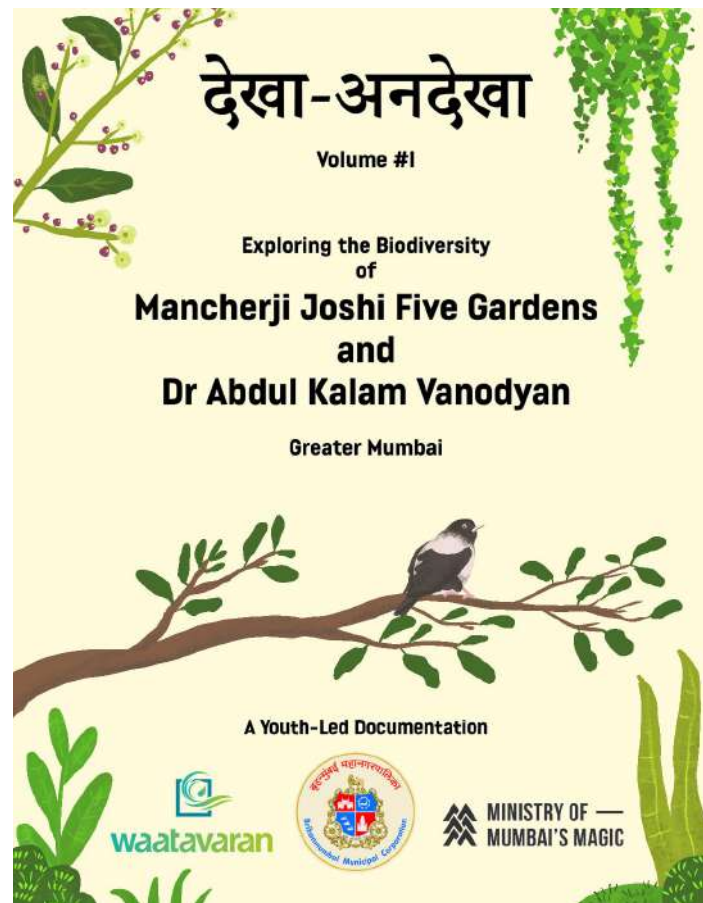
Thematic Highlights

Recognizing this pressing concern, Waatavarán's initiative takes root by fostering curiosity and sharing information among citizens about the characteristic attributes of two distinguished parks, namely Mancherji Joshi Five Gardens and Dr. Abdul Kalam Vanodyan, Mumbai. By encouraging community-driven preservation endeavors, Waatavarán undertakes to safeguard these valuable spaces.

Advocating for Clean Air

Exploring Waste to Energy (WtE): Film Screening and Panel Discussion



In collaboration with the Centre for Financial Accountability (CFA), we hosted an enlightening film screening and panel discussion at the Mumbai Press Club. The focus? Waste to Energy (WtE) and its potential role in waste management. Our esteemed panelists, including Swathi Sambyal, Faiyaz Shaikh, Dr. A. D. Sawant, and Dr. Amita Athavale, illuminated the complexities surrounding this topic.

The panelists shed light on the environmental risks linked with WtE technologies, from air pollution to toxic residue, urging caution against viewing WtE as a one-size-fits-all solution. Faiyaz Shaikh emphasized the social implications, particularly for marginalized communities, advocating for inclusive decision-making and community engagement.

Swathi Sambyal championed a circular economy approach, emphasizing waste prevention, reuse, and recycling over incineration. She called for policies promoting resource conservation and waste minimization. Dr. Amita Athavale highlighted potential health risks, stressing the need for robust health impact assessments near WtE facilities to safeguard public health. Dr. A. D. Sawant shared insights into technological advancements in WtE processes, underlining the importance of ongoing research to improve efficiency and minimize environmental impacts.

Sustainable Mobility

Perception of Mumbai's Youth regarding Last Mile Deliveries



In a bid to grasp the pulse of young Mumbaikars, Waatavaran embarked on a journey of perception, delving into the realms of last mile deliveries (LMD) and electric vehicles (EVs). Around 2,400 vibrant souls aged 18-35 shared their insights across Mumbai's diverse landscapes. The survey unveiled an undeniable yearning among the youth for eco-friendly last mile delivery options, especially through the embrace of electric vehicles. It underscored the urgent call for supportive policies, incentives, and infrastructure to ease the transition towards EVs in the delivery sector, in harmony with the state's EV policy aspirations

The stage was set for a riveting exchange as luminaries from varied backgrounds took their seats. Dr. Ratoola Kundu, from Tata Institute of Social Sciences (TISS), Mumbai, shed light on the social and environmental ramifications of last mile deliveries, advocating for inclusive policies and stakeholder engagement. Mr. Kaustubh Gosavi, representing the World Resources Institute (WRI), delved into sustainable urban mobility solutions, extolling the virtues of electric vehicles and innovative business models. Ms. Sohana Debbarma, a PhD Scholar from Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Bombay, offered a technical perspective on EV integration and the imperative of robust charging infrastructure

With bated breath, the report on young Mumbaikars' views on last mile deliveries was unveiled, graced by the esteemed presence of Mr. Vivek Bhimanvar, Transport Commissioner, Maharashtra State. His words echoed the urgency to confront the environmental footprint of last mile deliveries, applauding Waatavaran's diligent efforts in conducting this profound study. The government's unwavering commitment to fostering sustainable transportation solutions, notably EV adoption in last mile deliveries, was reiterated.

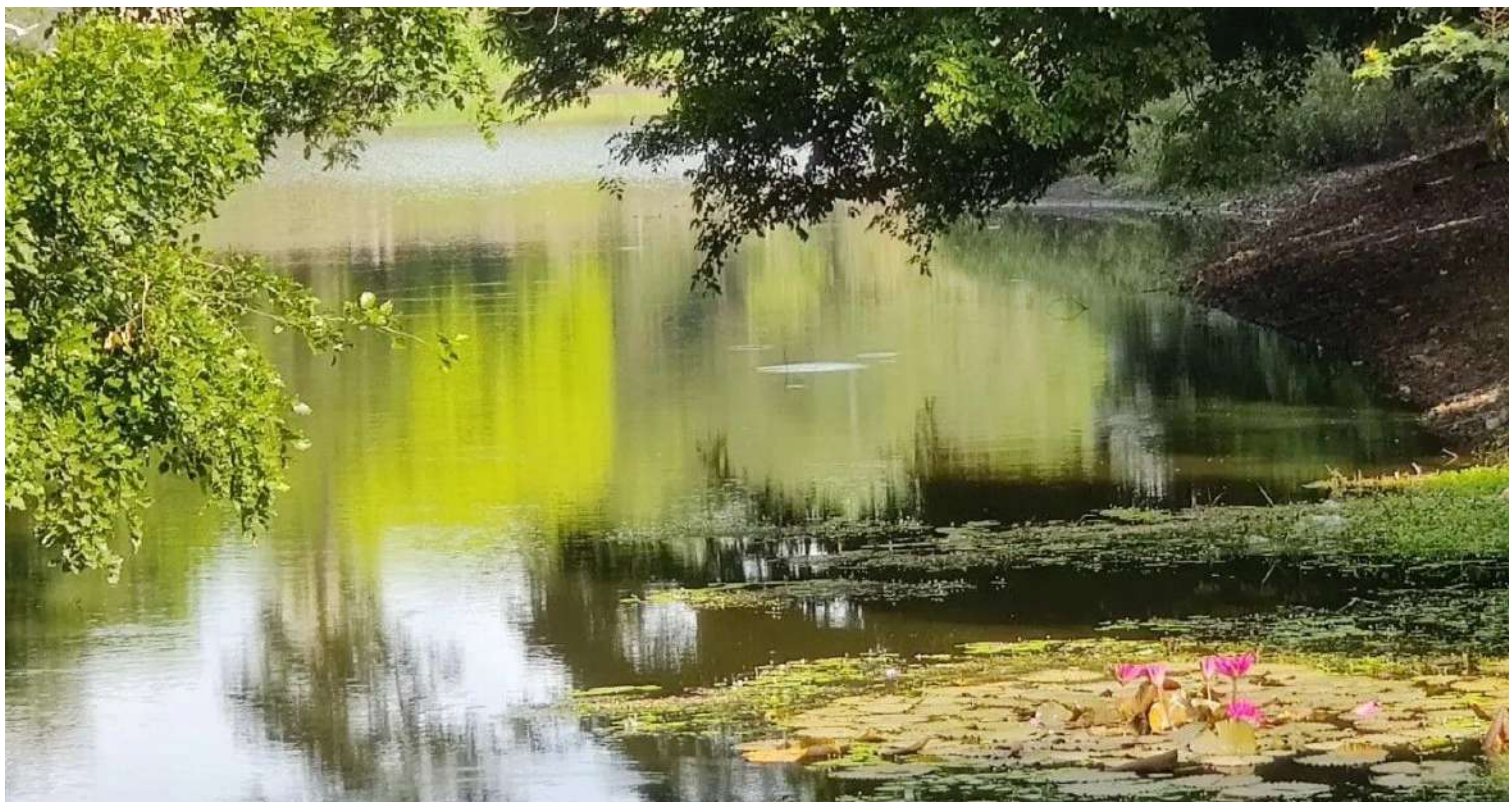

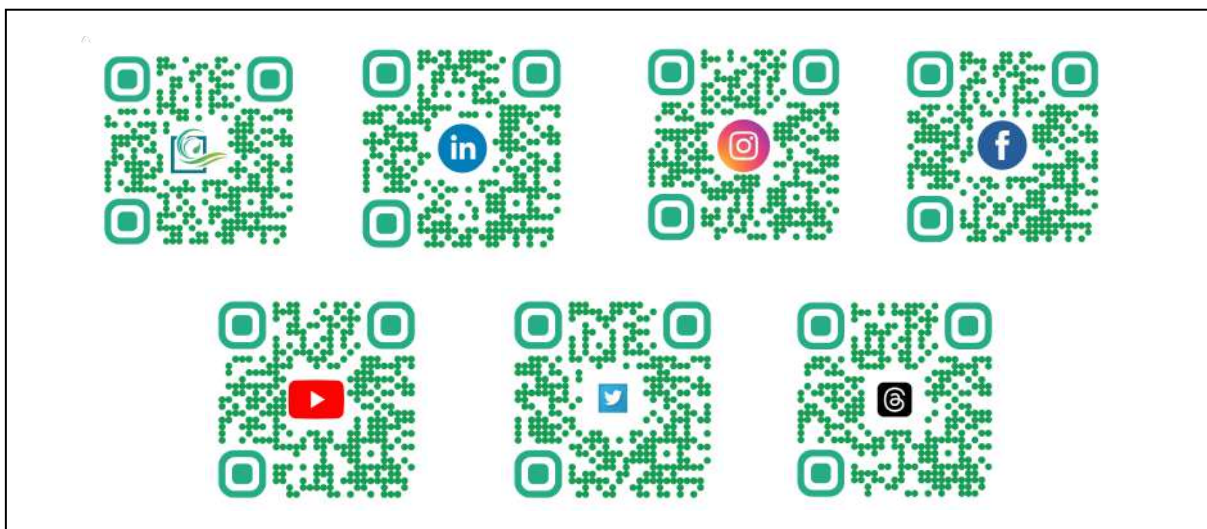
